Meeting called to order at 1304. Stieve noted compliance with open meeting law. Moved by Koss, seconded by Schauf, to approve agenda and carried unanimously. Motion to approve meeting minutes of May 28, 2015 by Koss, Schauf added one correction to minutes, approved, and seconded by Schauf and unanimously approved.

Sign in on ICS Form 211 – Form was passed around and signatures were obtained.

Department of Corrections Presentation

Cregg Reuter of DOC gave short introduction of his role in agency. Kathy Laatch, Sauk County Probation & Parole Supervisor and Kevin Smith, Supervisor with DOC provided facts about current offenders in Sauk County:

- Currently there are 880 offenders in Sauk County with some sort of monitoring system, this includes 14 offenders that are classified as N.G.I. (Not Guilty by Insanity).
- Home visits are done during non-traditional times/polygraphs are being used on sex offenders.
- There are 11 agents in Baraboo, more are needed;
- Different types of monitoring systems are used depending on offender – home monitor, Ankle with GPS;
- 10 offenders are high risk in Baraboo area at this time.
- The DOC and Probation & Parole have a plan in place in case of an event with power or phone outages. Offenders would be picked up/secured/restricted from general population areas. If shelters were set up Kathy or agents would do a walk thru for any offenders.

Baraboo School District Emergency Preparedness

Dani Scott added that School District is working closely with Sauk County Sheriff and Baraboo PD.

- All Sauk County schools are using the same terminology;
- ALICE (Alert/Lockdown/Inform/Counter/Evacuate) training is in the works
- Security is being upgraded in the schools, relocating offices to make them more secure
- Each August a plan review is held
- Knox boxes are at all schools
- Better communication is needed between schools and local agencies
- Further discussion is needed on how to handle an event during games, school trips, etc.
- Discussion on suicide rate increase in teens

Sauk County Reunification Plan

Jeff suggested having 4-5 rooms set up: parents check in and should be separate from radio room – give them correct and current information and keep them updated.

Wrist bands: Blue – Staff
Yellow – Students
Green – Parents

- Parent and student identification on wristbands would be paired up and parent shows photo identification before student is allowed to go with them.
- Need enough staff that is trained to organize and run the reunification plan
- This system works easily and could be used in a business, a water park, zoo, etc.

St. Clare Update Kelly Lapp added the survey that took place earlier in the month went well, with no deficiencies. An event happened where a patient they thought had ebola was brought in from Sauk County jail who was on the watch list. Situation could have been handled better. Upcoming trainings/drills in July will be infant abduction and active shooter.
