

**Procedure for Direct Annexation of Land into the City Pursuant to Section 66.0217 Wis. Stats.
(Where There Are Residents in the Territory to be Annexed)**

BEFORE ANY PETITION IS FILED, PETITIONER MUST REQUEST A MEETING WITH THE CITY'S DEVELOPMENT REVIEW COMMITTEE. CONTACT KRIS JACKSON OR CHUCK BONGARD TO BE PLACED ON THE NEXT AGENDA: 355-2730.

The following is an outline of the procedure to be followed for the direct annexation of lands into the City where there are residents in the territory to be annexed:

1. The parties petitioning for annexation shall file with the City Clerk a Petition for Direct Annexation by Unanimous Consent. The Petition shall be in the form as set forth and attached hereto; shall be signed by all electors residing in the territory to be annexed and by all the owners of the territory to be annexed; shall contain a scale map and the legal description of the territory to be annexed, and shall specify the zoning classification requested upon annexation. The Petition must also specify the population of the territory to be annexed based upon the last federal census.

The **legal description** of the land to be annexed must be a complete description without internal references to any other document and **must** be described in one of the following ways:

- a. By metes and bounds commencing at a monument at the section or quarter section corner or at the end of a boundary line of a recorded private claim or federal reservation in which the annexed land is located and be described in one of the following ways:
 - (1) By government lot.
 - (2) By recorded private claim.
 - (3) By quarter section, section, township, and range.
- b. If the land is located in a recorded subdivision or in an area subject to a certified survey map, reference must be made in one of the following ways:
 - (1) For a plat, describe the name of the plat and the lot and block in the plat (See s.236.28, WI Stats.).
 - (2) For certified survey maps, describe the number of the survey, the volume and page where recorded, and the name of the county (See s.236.34(3), WI Stats.).

The **scale map** must be a map that accurately reflects the legal description of the territory to be annexed and the boundary of the City of Baraboo and **must** include a graphic scale on the face of the map. (See Section 66.0217, Wis. Stats.)

2. The petitioners must attach to the Petition a copy of a survey map or a copy of a scale map showing the boundaries of the area proposed for annexation and their relationship to the City of Baraboo. If a scale map is used, the map must accurately reflect the legal description of the property to be annexed, and it must include all of the following:
 - a. Accurately reflect the legal description of the property; and
 - b. The boundary of the City of Baraboo; and
 - c. A graphic scale on the face of the map.
3. On the same day that the Petition is filed with the City, an identical Petition, also originally signed by the petitioners, must be filed by the petitioners with the Town Clerk of the township in which the territory is presently located.

4. Within five (5) days after the Petition for Direct Annexation is filed with the City, the petitioner must file the following additional documents with the City Clerk:
 - a. Affidavit of Ownership and Residency in the form attached hereto.
 - b. Affidavit of Filing in the form attached hereto.

These forms must be prepared by the petitioner, at his/her expense, and must be properly completed before the City will consider the proposed annexation.

5. Within five (5) days of the filing of the Petition for Direct Annexation with the City Clerk, the Clerk shall mail to the Director of the Municipal Boundary Review Department of the State of Wisconsin Department of Administration copies of the following documents: (1) Petition for Direct Annexation, (2) Scale map or survey map showing the boundaries of the proposed annexation area and relationship to the City, and (3) A legal description of the territory to be annexed.

These documents shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt, to the following address:

Upon receipt of the above documents, the Department of Administration may request the City Clerk to complete a questionnaire providing more details regarding the annexation. If additional information is requested by the Department of Administration, the City Clerk shall provide the pertinent information to the Department of Administration within 10 days after receiving a request for additional information.

Under Section 66.0217(6)), WI Stats., the Department of Administration is required to make its review of the annexation within 20 days after receipt of the notice from the City and to provide its opinion as to whether or not the annexation is against the public interest. The Common Council is required by Section 66.0217(2), WI Stats., to "review the advice of the Department, if any, before enacting the annexation ordinance."

6. The documents (petition, survey or scale map, Affidavit of Ownership and Residency, and Affidavit of Filing) shall be submitted to the Plan Commission. The Plan Commission shall review the proposed annexation and shall make a recommendation to the Common Council. The Commission shall make a recommendation as to whether the proposed lands should be annexed to the City and shall make a recommendation as to the zoning for the annexed lands.
7. After receiving the Plan Commission's recommendation, the Common Council shall adopt a resolution setting a public hearing date to consider zoning for the territory proposed for annexation. Unless otherwise specified in the Annexation Ordinance, all annexed territory shall be zoned 1 and 2 family residential (R-2) by the City. The law does not require a public hearing to deal with the issue whether the proposed territory should be annexed to the City; however, the law does require a public hearing to establish the zoning for lands annexed and the sole purpose of the public hearing shall be to consider zoning only, not the annexation itself, although the two may be interrelated. (The City may annex territory and temporarily zone the land and thereafter schedule and hold a public hearing to permanently zone the land.)
8. Pursuant to Section 66.0217(2), WI Stats., a 2/3rds vote of the elected members of Council is necessary to adopt an ordinance annexing territory to the City.

These procedures, and the attached forms, are only for the use of City of Baraboo officials. This procedure is not intended to give legal advice to any person petitioning for annexation to the City of Baraboo and any person petitioning for annexation of territory to the City is advised to seek legal advice from a personal attorney. The City reserves the right to change the above procedures at any time and the City disclaims any liability whatsoever to any person for any loss, damage, claim or delay incurred as a result of using or relying on the above procedures.

ADDENDUM TO ANNEXATION PROCEDURES

Section 66.0217(14) of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that no territory may be annexed by the City unless the City agrees to pay annually to the Town an amount equal to the amount of property taxes that the Town levied on the annexed territory as shown by the tax roll in the year in which the annexation is final. The City Council has determined that, unless special circumstances exist, the owner of the territory proposed for annexation shall reimburse the City for the annual tax paid by the City to the Township under this ordinance. The annexation ordinance adopted by the Common Council will usually provide the following:

“The owner of the territory proposed for annexation shall reimburse the City for the annual tax paid by the City to the Township from which the property has been detached for the period and to the extent required by Section 66.0217(14), Wis. Stats. If the charge is not paid within 30 days after being invoiced, such charge shall be extended upon the current or next tax roll as a special tax against the annexed property and shall accrue interest at the rate of one percent per month until paid.”



REVISED ANNEXATION REVIEW FEES

Wisconsin State Statute 16.53 (14), as created by 2001 Wisconsin Act 16, provides that the Department of Administration may "prescribe and collect a fee for review of any petition for incorporation of a municipality under s. 66.023 or any petition for annexation of municipal territory under s.66.0217." By statute, the Department is required to set fees that will recover all costs of operation.

Accordingly, beginning October 1, 2007, the following fees will be required with any request for review of petitions of annexation. These fees will be reviewed annually and adjusted as required. The Department of Administration will distribute revised fee announcements, as necessary.

Annexation Petition Review Fee

The total annexation petition review fee consists of a one-time file fee and a review fee based on acreage as follows.

Initial Filing Fee

2 acres or less	\$200
2.01 acres or more	\$350


Acreage Review Fee

2 acres or less	\$200
2.01 - 10 acres	\$600
10.01 - 50 acres	\$800
50.01 - 100 acres	\$1,000
100.01 - 200 acres	\$1,400
200.01 - 500 acres	\$2,000
500.01+ acres	\$4,000

The person or persons filing the intent to circulate the petition or the petition of the proposed annexation pay the annexation petition review fee. The fee (a check or money order payable to: Department of Administration) must accompany the documents submitted to the department.
